The Single Parent Resource Center, Inc., located in mid-town Manhattan, was started in 1975 as a small pilot program of the Community Service Society of New York. Now, The Single Parent Resource Center is the only independent, not-for-profit organization devoted solely to providing education and support services to a racially and ethnically diverse population of more than 2,000 of New York City's single parent families annually. Our services are available to all single parents, including those who are living in transitional housing; struggling with substance abuse; or have been released from incarceration. To further our mission, SPRC does the following:

- Develops responsive programs for single parents and their families to fulfill unmet needs.
- 2. Advocates for improvements in social practices, policies and regulations that affect single parent families.
- 3. Promotes a positive image of single parents and their families within the community.

In FY 2023, SPRC served over 2,000 single parents and their families through the following program service accomplishments:

PROGRAMS FOR PARENTS

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES PROGRAM:

SFP is an evidence-based family skills training program found to significantly improve parenting skills and family relationships, while reducing problem behaviors, delinquency and substance abuse. Workshops include topics such as identifying developmentally appropriate behavior; setting realistic goals and objectives; rewarding positive behavior; ignoring negative behavior; fostering healthy communication; and setting limits.
